

#### **UPDATE #113 - 12.10.2022**

Welcome to this update.

I am acutely conscious of the cost-of-living concerns that many people in our community are grappling with. Notwithstanding the energy support support to Cheltenham (over £70m is coming to our town alone to reduce bills) serious pressures remain. I am doing everything in my power to assist, and those who wish to email me should not hesitate to do so.

This update focuses on specific Cheltenham-related issues. So, there is news on the positive outcome for Cheltenham regarding the **Air Balloon** scheme, which was named second in a list of 138 schemes expected to begin construction in 2023.

Do look out too for the latest on the campaign for a brand-new **Gloucestershire Cancer Institute** at **Cheltenham General Hospital**. Following on from the new multi-million pound hospital wing going up near the Lido, I'm determined to go further to strengthen health infrastructure in the town.

Remaining with health, I and the other Gloucestershire MPs have called for a meeting this Friday with the leadership of the Integrated Care Board to discuss the conclusions of the recent **CQC inspection** into Gloucestershire Royal and Cheltenham General hospitals. I have also been in contact with the ICB to seek reassurance about plans to surge resources at **Leckhampton Surgery**.

As well as detailed information about **energy support** there's a 'grot-spot' update of course (!) with progress made on tackling potholes in Warden Hill and on Campden Road. And if you've been affected by **Stagecoach reliability issues**, you can find out the latest below (although I expect a further announcement from Stagecoach shortly).

Finally, although it's a bit niche I realise, I gave a speech recently about **prison reform**. As a former Prisons Minister I am only too aware that we lock up more people per head than almost any other country in Europe, at a cost of around £40,000 per prisoner. We need to start looking at focusing on **imprisoning people we are scared of, not everyone we are cross with**. That's how we get value for money for the taxpayer, and drive real rehabilitation.

He is supporting local clinicians have put together plans for a brand new three-storey hospital wing. This would provide **cutting-edge Systemic Anti-Cancer Therapy and new consulting rooms** - as well as a pelvic resection centre and a robotic cancer resection centre.

A dedicated new wing would support **earlier screening**, **faster diagnosis and referral**, and improve treatment for people living with and beyond cancer.

This flagship investment would guarantee the long-term future of Cheltenham General Hospital as a Regional Cancer Centre.

#### "THE UNACCEPTABLE FACE OF CAPITALISM"

Now on the back benches, Alex has wasted no time in speaking out, warning Severn Trent that unless they deliver on their "cast-iron commitment" to clean up the River Chelt, people would rightly conclude that they represent the "unacceptable face of capitalism".

After months of behind-the-scenes pressure, **Severn Trent pledged to Alex that they will reduce spills into the Chelt by 85%** by the end of 2024 - much faster than elsewhere in the country. A spokesperson for Severn Trent has said:

"We have had detailed discussions with Alex Chalk over recent weeks, and he has made his concerns very clear. Although the River Chelt has been getting cleaner over recent years, we now accept we need to go further and faster. So we are pleased to announce a cast-iron commitment to reduce overflows into the River Chelt by 85% by the end of 2024...we will do whatever it takes."

Severn Trent have now finished installing new technical equipment in the combined sewage overflow in Charlton Kings. Alex has been assured that **the final engineering solution will be deployed later this year.**

ALEX SWIMS A KILOMETRE TO BACK MOTOR NEURONE DISEASE FIGHT

Alex joined swimmers at the **Motor Neurone Disease Association** Sandford Lido swimathon to help raise vitals funds for the MND Association.

The MND Association help to fund research, improve care and provide support for

people with MND, their families and carers. 26 swimmers participated and £7,000 was raised for the MND Association.

Writing on Facebook, Alex said:

"Amazing turnout at the Sanford Parks Lido on Sunday to fundraise for MND Association Sandford Lido swimathon. I managed a derisory one kilometre (20 lengths), but many congratulations to the swimmers who knocked off 2k (40 lengths).

"There is a 1 in 300 risk of getting Motor Neurone Disease across a lifetime, and many of us will know of someone affected by this cruel disease, including here in Cheltenham. But with £50m recently committed for UK research, there is hope for the future."

## SPADES IN THE GROUND EXPECTED IN 2023! MAJOR MILESTONE FOR A417 AIR BALLOON PROJECT

Alex has welcomed the Chancellor's announcement that the A417 Air Balloon Missing Link Project will be "accelerated as fast as possible" as part of the Growth Plan.

The announcement came as the Government pledged to cut barriers and restrictions for 130 major infrastructure projects, making it quicker to plan and build new roads, rail and energy infrastructure.

The A417 Air Balloon Missing Link Project is being funded by £435m of Government funding to build a new 3.4 mile dual carriageway linking the M4 and the M5.

Alex said: "This announcement represents a major milestone in resolving the A417 bottleneck which has contributed to countless fatal accidents over the years. This project will save lives, cut pollution and boost Cheltenham's economy and I am increasingly confident that work will begin in the next twelve months."



## **ALEX JOINS CHELTENHAM CYCLE STARS**


Alex was delighted to join Cheltenham Cycle Stars for their regular session at Belmont School.

#### ALEX BACKS PLANS TO TACKLE HIGH BLOOD PRESSURE AND HEART DISEASE

Alex met with the **British Heart Foundation** at the Party Conference in Birmingham to support the BHF's research into heart and circulatory diseases.

Alex also reaffirmed his support for the NHS Long Term Plan which includes plans to prevent up to 150,000 heart attacks, strokes, and dementia cases over the next ten years.

Alex is also backing the Government's plan to improve survival from out of hospital

cardiac arrest by boosting defibrillator networks and increasing the number of community first responders.



### **ALEX HAILS THE 'EXTRAORDINARY CONTRIBUTION' OF CHELTENHAM YMCA**

As Vice-President of the Cheltenham YMCA, Alex was invited to address the AGM at the YMCA Sports Centre in Cheltenham.

Alex reflected on the **extraordinary contribution Cheltenham YMCA** continues to make to the town - through the supported housing in Vittoria Walk, but also accommodating the **homeless hub** which is staffed 24 hours a day, seven days a week to provide a safe environment away from the street.

YMCA provides more than 1,750 bed nights per week in Gloucestershire, including supported accommodation for people affected by homelessness and those requiring a helping hand before living independently in the community.

### **ALEX CALLS FOR PRISON REFORM**

Former Minister for Prisons and Probation, Alex attended the Howard League for Penal Reform panel event at the Conservative Party conference to discuss the UK's growing prison population (currently over 85,000 and rising).

Observing that the UK locks up over double the number of criminals than Germany, at a cost of over £40,000 per prisoner per year, Alex stated: "This is costing taxpayers a fortune. We need a system where we lock up people we are scared of, not all the people we are cross with."

As Solicitor General, Alex successfully sought longer sentences for violent and sexual offenders. He support long sentences which keep the public safe from dangerous criminals, but wants to see a greater emphasis on robust unpaid work orders as an

alternative to custody in lower-level offences.

Alex added that it is very important to reduce the rate of "churn" of Band 3 wing officers in prisons. He noted that experience built up over years of service allows officers to best judge when they need to be robust and when to offer support to a prisoner who may be struggling.



ALEX RENEWS CALL FOR COMPENSATION FOR 1950'S WOMEN

As Cheltenham's MP, Alex has been **an active supporter of the Women Against State Pension Injustice (WASPI) pensions campaign.** 

He was a founder member of the All Party Parliamentary Group on State Pension Inequality for Women and has spoken in several debates in Parliament. He also held a public meeting in Cheltenham for women affected by the changes to the state pension age for women born in the 1950s.

Alex has **renewed his call for compensation for the 5,600 1950s-born women** in Cheltenham by signing the WASPI campaign pledge for fair and fast compensation for

1950s-born women.

Hilary Simpson, national chair of WASPI and co-ordinator of the Cheltenham group, said: "Alex has been a consistent WASPI supporter. We are delighted that he has signed the pledge to highlight our campaign for fair and fast compensation."



**BETTER VALUE TRAIN FARES FOR CHELTENHAM** 

Campaigning for improved **train services and more affordable tickets** has long been a key area of focus for Alex.


He has therefore welcomed Great Western Railway's introduction of a new **pay-as-you-go smartcard** to roll payments and tickets into one, ensuring customers get the **best value on the day of travel.** 

The card will enable passengers to get **best value on walk-up fares for the day of travel, plus the capping of weekly season ticket prices.** 

Alex said: "I welcome GWR's new Pay-As-You-Go scheme – a first for our region – which is being launched for Cheltenham. It's important that passengers can travel to places like Bristol or Gloucester and have confidence that they will be getting the best value fare. I'm pleased too that GWR have ensured the scheme works across other rail operators including CrossCountry and Transport for Wales."

**ALEX ATTENDS GLOS PRIDE 2022** 

Alex backed Glos Pride 2022 and joined the celebration of Gloucestershire's LGBTQ+ community.

The event began with a parade through Gloucester City centre before ending at Gloucester Park.

Alex said: "Glos Pride is not just about individuals showing confidence in who they are; it's about the community showing its pride in them too."



**GLOS COL GOES GREEN WITH GOVERNMENT HELP** 

Alex was delighted to be invited to see the results of the latest £3m Government investment into Gloucestershire College's Hesters Way campus.

The money has delivered a major engineering project to enable the college to become the first in the country to move to 100% renewable energy, slashing bills and emissions at the same time.

This project follows a separate £3m investment by the Government into Hesters Way's Advanced Digital Academy (ADA) at GlosCol. The ADA is a state-of-the art facility. It is also the base for the UK's first-ever GCHQ/NCSC-accredited cyber skills course.

Alex said: "I believe in a town where young people are able to walk around in our local community and see the bright lights of opportunity on our doorstep. GlosCol, working with Government and the cyber sector, can help provide that better future for all young people – including those who may not have had the easiest start in life, but are prepared to work hard to fulfil their potential."



### **ALEX PLEDGES TO SUPPORT CARE LEAVERS**

Alex met with young people supported by Barnardo's to understand the challenges that care leavers face.

Alex heard how children who grow up in care often do less well in school, have poorer mental health, less employment opportunities and are more likely to be homeless.

Alex is supporting the Government's bold and ambitious response to the publication of the Independent Review of Children's Social Care which includes:

- setting up a new National Implementation Board of sector experts and people with experience of leading transformational change and the care system;
- boosting efforts to recruit more foster carers;
- increased support for social workers including on leadership, recruitment and retention;
- the implementation of a new evidence-based framework for all the professionals working in children's social care

### JOBS BOOST FOR PEOPLE WITH LEARNING DISABILITIES

Alex recently met with **Cheltenham Autistic Social Group** to understand the challenges they face with finding a job.

Following lobbying from Alex, the **Government has awarded Gloucestershire £210,000** to help adults with **learning disabilities and autism to move into work.** 

The funding and support will include assigning job coaches who can carry out vocation profiling, engage employers and provide in-work support to help people to maintain that employment.

This is part of the Government's plan to help a million more disabled people in work by 2027.

Alex said: "We know that those with autism and learning disabilities can face particular barriers to employment so I am delighted that Cheltenham will benefit from £210,000 funding to break down those barriers and secure effective employment to help more people in Cheltenham reach their full potential."



## FREE BUSINESS NETWORKING IN CHELTENHAM

### ALEX ENCOURAGES THE GOVERNMENT TO FOCUS ON TACKLING DISINFORMATION

During a debate on the situation in Ukraine, Alex encouraged the Government and international community to continue to **tackle Putin's disinformation**.

#### Alex asked the Minister:

"As the Kremlin grows more desperate, the disinformation grows more dishonest. What more can we do to ensure that the false narrative the Kremlin is seeking to peddle—namely, the complete dishonesty and fallacy that there are NATO troops in Ukraine—is entirely exposed for the sham that it is?"

#### The Minister responded:

"I think we have been clear throughout that NATO is not an active participant in this conflict. Putin tries to claim daily on Russian television that it is, but in reality, all that NATO has done as an organisation since February is to reinforce its eastern flank to guard against contagion in the conflict. It is purely a false narrative peddled by President Putin to say anything otherwise."



ALEX BACKS PLANS FOR NEW MENTAL WELLBEING SERVICE FOR GLOUCESTERSHIRE

Alex is backing Gloucestershire County Council's plans to introduce a new service to support adult mental wellbeing.

GCC are introducing anonymous support on a drop-in basis for people experiencing anxiety, stress, or low mood; alongside support for self-harm.

Support will be available over the phone or via text/webchat; and will not require a referral from a professional.

Alex said: "Mental health is something I feel very strongly about and I welcome the huge progress we have made in understanding mental health issues.

"I fully support Gloucestershire County Council's plans for a new mental wellbeing service to ensure that people in Gloucestershire are able to access early specialist support when they need it."

### THREE NEW SPECIALIST FIRE SERVICE VEHICLES FOR GLOUCESTERSHIRE

Gloucestershire County Council has announced that it will invest £1.25 million in purchasing three new specialist fire service vehicles for Gloucestershire.

An Aerial Ladder Platform, Incident Command Unit and Crane Unit will be purchased to maintain an effective operational response to keep communities safe.

They are also more environmentally friendly than the old fleet as they use greener engines, so the amount of emissions they produce is reduced.

The vehicles will also help ensure the average availability of GFRS fire engines remains high. Currently the average availability is 91.8 per cent, higher than the average across England of 86.4 per cent.

Alex said: "I travel to the overwhelming majority of my appointments on my bike so I welcome the creation of the new Cheltenham-Gloucester cycle path. Plans to make cycling safer are essential if we are to encourage more people onto bikes.

"Investing in public transport, as well as walking and cycling are crucial to building a cleaner, greener, healthier future. With vision and common sense, an historic opportunity to improve transport in Cheltenham can be seized."

New support for households and businesses

#### **ENERGY BILL RELIEF FOR CHELTENHAM**

Alex has been lobbying Ministers for further Government support to help the people of Cheltenham with the rising cost of living.

He has therefore welcomed the Government's introduction of the **Energy Price Guarantee** which means a typical UK household **will now pay up to an average £2,500 a year** on their energy bill for the next two years.

This will save the average household at least £1,000 a year and is in addition to the £400 energy bills discount for all households.

Action is also being taken to **tackle the root cause of the issues** by boosting domestic energy supply, including new oil and gas, wind, solar, hydrogen, and nuclear technologies.

Alex said: "The relief on energy bills is very welcome. I am very pleased that a typical Cheltenham household will save an average of £1,000 a year on their energy bills.

"The action being taken will reduce the worrying burden in the short term and will invigorate the long-term reforms needed to tackle the underlying problems in the energy market so that we have affordable energy in future."

# ENERGY SUPPORT FOR CHELTENHAM'S BUSINESSES, CHARITIES, SCHOOLS AND HOSPITALS

Alex has been meeting with Cheltenham businesses so that he can better understand the challenges they are facing with energy costs and rising inflation.

He has used these meetings to provide 'frontline' examples of the pressures facing local businesses when lobbying Treasury Ministers for swift action to support Cheltenham's businesses.

Alex has therefore welcomed the introduction of the Government's **Energy Bill Relief Scheme** which will provide a **discount on wholesale gas and electricity prices** for all non-domestic customers (including all **businesses**, **charities**, **schools and hospitals**) whose current gas and electricity prices have been significantly inflated in light of global energy prices.

Alex said: "I warmly welcome the decisive support on energy bills to support Cheltenham's businesses over the winter and to help protect jobs and livelihoods. Without it we would have seen a business bloodbath in Cheltenham this winter."





# NEW £40M CHELTENHAM HOSPITAL WING NEARS COMPLETION!

Local people will soon see the benefits of a state-of-the-art surgical facility following lobbying by local MP Alex Chalk

A brand new £40m Surgical Unit is being built opposite the Lido, and will be opening its doors in just a few months.

Containing two new state-of-the-art operating theatres, the Chedworth Surgical Unit will treat an extra 3,000 patients a year

The building will host a new purposebuilt Day Surgery Unit, with surgeons performing operations on hips, knees and the abdomen.

It will also contain a brand-new Interventional Radiology room to carry out a range of advanced procedures, shortening recovery time and improving patient outcomes.

The unit will open to patients in January next year, with the two new theatres entering service in September 2023.

#### **Cancer Treatment**

Cheltenham General's Radiology Department has received a major upgrade thanks to a separate £6.5m Government grant. The money has gone on purchasing the latest Siemens scapners – CT X-Rau and MRI. This equipment means smaller radiation doses, a bigger scan area, better image resolution, and improved infection control through sophisticated

ventilation systems.
It also gives CGH the facilities for stroke patients to go straight to a CT scanner, speeding up treatment. Uralogy patients can also go straight to interventional radiology, improving outcomes.

The investment follows delivery of the LINAC concer-busting machines in 2018.

#### Alex Chalk said:

"This investment shows Cheltenham General is on the up, with facilities improving year on year. "Thank you to all those in our local NHS who helped me bang the drum!

"Now, I want to go even further.

"Working with our brilliant oncology team, I am pressing to make Cheltenham a centre of excellence for cancer treatment with a brand new 3-storey hospital wing.

#### £30M SCHOOL READY FOR STUDENTS

In 2015 Alex pledged to campaign for a new school for Chettenham if elected. Seven years later, the brand new \$30 million High School Leckhampton is receiving its first students! Warden Hill Primary is also benefiting from a £75 million carbon neutral school building with £5.3m also being invested in upgrades at Belmant Special School, Pitrville and Leckhampton Primary.



### CLEANING UP THE RIVER CHELT

Since Alex secured the historic commitment from Severn Trent to clean up the River Chelt, ST has begun installing new equipment in the combined sewage overflow in Charlton Kings. The final engineering solution to slosh discharges will be rotted out toter this year.

Alex helped to secure £2.8m in Government funding to enable Gloucestershire College to replace gas boilers with emission-free heat pumps at the college's two campuses. This will support the college in reaching net zero. The Government has already awarded £3m to GlosCol to create the Advanced Digital Academy in Hesters Way.

#### **£70M COST OF LIVING SUPPORT** FOR CHELTENHAM

Over the summer, a significant package of support was secured for Cheltenham to help with the rising cost of living. Residents will receive over \$70m of Government support in total, with \$40m coming in the form of cash payments or rebates. This is in addition to the \$355m support to Cheltenham during Covid.



#### IVORY BAN COMES INTO FORCE

Alax's long campaign for an ivory trade ban is now in force. The legislation took effect in June 2022 and outlaws dealing in ivory items unless they meet one of five narrow exemptions. This means the UK now has one of the toughest ivory bans in the world.



#### SAFER STREETS' FUNDING

Following lobbying from Alex and the Police and Crime Commissioner Chris Nelson. Cheltenham has been awarded £194,514 from the Home Office's Safer Streets Fund. The cosh will be used to tackle violence against women and girts and anti-social behaviour, with more CCTV, better street lights and a Street Drink Worker.
