

e-UPDATE #117 - 26.2.23

Welcome to this latest update.

It has been a frenetic few weeks, and there are updates below on everything from an announcement I made about new **space-related defence jobs for Gloucestershire**, to cutting steel on the Royal Navy's latest **Dreadnought**-class submarine. And there's the latest on my personal hobby-horse - **Cheltenham roads resurfacing** of course!

One major highlight from the last few weeks is the hugely welcome news that the Department for Health and Social Care has agreed to invest £10.2m in Cheltenham General Hospital to build a new orthopaedic theatre and birthing unit. The state-of-the-art theatre will benefit from high-tech ultraclean ventilation, multi-use carbon fibre theatre tables, and technology to facilitate robot-assisted surgery. It takes the total amount invested in our hospital in recent years to over £40m.

There is also an update below on my recent meeting with **Severn Trent bosses.** Following their "castiron" pledge (their words not mine!) to me to clean up the River Chelt, they've been working up **engineering solutions** for the **Charlton Kings site.** I'm pressing for an announcement on the engineering scheme by the end of March.

I was delighted to attend **CGH's Endoscopy Unit charity barn dance** at St Matthew's Church (shame about my two left feet...) and the **Cheltenham Samaritans' Beer Festival** at Pip and Jim's. And it was brilliant to celebrate Cheltenham Park Run's tenth anniversary!

There is also a summary below of my recent ministerial visits to **India and France**. I led a UK delegation to Lucknow to secure investment openings for British businesses, and was pleased to be able to **highlight Cheltenham's cyber and defence industries to an international audience**.

I am also pleased to be supporting GCC's plans to create a **green corridor for wildlife** by planting more than **3,000 trees** on the disused railway site between Bournside School and Canterbury Walk.

UPDATES



£10.2M FOR ORTHOPAEDIC THEATRE AND BIRTHING UNIT AT CGH

Alex is delighted that the Government has agreed to invest £10.2m in Cheltenham General Hospital to build a new orthopaedic centre and birthing unit.

The state-of-the-art theatre will specialise in **hip and knee replacements**, and will benefit from high-tech ultra-clean ventilation, multi-use carbon fibre theatre tables,

and technology to facilitate robot-assisted surgery.

In addition, the birthing unit at Cheltenham General will be transformed into a purpose-built midwifery-led birthing unit, with two new birthing rooms including pools. **Works are expected to start later in the year.**

This latest funding comes on top of the multi-million pound investment into the new hospital wing opposite the Lido.

It takes the total amount received by Cheltenham General in government investment since **2015 to over £40m.**

STORM OVERFLOW ENGINEERING SOLUTION IMMINENT

After months of behind-the-scenes pressure, **Severn Trent pledged to Alex in 2022 that they would reduce spills into the Chelt by 85%** by the end of 2024 - much faster than elsewhere in the country.

This will address a sewage overflow problem that has existed in Cheltenham for decades when heavy rainfall overwhelms the drainage system.

To keep the pressure on Severn Trent, Alex called a meeting with senior management in January to call for engineering works to begin without delay.

Severn Trent confirmed to Alex that they have completed all of the assessment work, and two engineering solutions have been developed. **Sign-off for the preferred scheme is expected by the end of March**, with an announcement expected shortly after.

We are closer than ever to seeing this historic problem fixed once and for all...

Alex was in Lucknow, India to secure investment openings for British businesses. As the keynote speaker at the Global Investment Summit, Alex had the unique opportunity to highlight Cheltenham's cyber and defence industries on the world stage.

Alex led a delegation of over 30 British businesses, including firms that are already partnering with Indian counterparts such as **BAE Systems**, Thales UK, MBDA UK and **Rolls-Royce**. Alex was delighted that at the summit they signed deals worth over £160m.

Cyber security and defence are growing fast in India. And with thousands of people in Gloucestershire employed by companies like BAe, GE Aviation, Ultra Electronics, Safran, Raytheon and CDS Defence & Security, we are well placed in our county to reap the benefits.

During the visit, Alex also had an emotional reunion with old friends from the Bakshi-katalab school he taught English at after leaving university.

BABCOCK MOD CONTRACT CREATES 400 JOBS

Alex was pleased to announce that Defence company Babcock - which has bases in Gloucestershire - has been awarded the contract to manage and operate **Skynet**, the UK Ministry of Defence's (MOD) military satellite communications system.

Babcock which has a base in Cheltenham in Enterprise Way and at Gloucestershire Airport, employs around 450 people across the county.

The six-year contract, with an initial value of **more than £400 million**, forms part of the MOD's £6 billion Skynet 6 programme, sustaining more than 400 jobs in the south-west of the UK.

Alex said:

"Space is increasingly important for maintaining battlefield advantage. The UK's next generation military satellite communications system will keep us at the forefront of this critical domain and the work under this contract will bolster our resilience for years to come."

ALEX RESPONDS TO BORIS JOHNSON AND LIZ TRUSS IN UKRAINE DEBATE

Alex was at the despatch box to update the House on Britain's military contribution to Ukraine.

Responding to speeches from **Boris Johnson** and **Liz Truss**, Alex paid tribute to the 'sheer bloody-minded defiance' of the Ukrainian people as he confirmed that the UK will continue to help lead the international military and diplomatic effort to uphold the international rules-based order.

"The signal we are sending to Vladimir Putin could not be clearer. He has turned his country into a pariah and the most sanctioned nation on the planet. Meanwhile, the world stands with Ukraine, ready to support that proud and defiant country to defend its territory and its people.

One year on, with Russia gearing up for a new offensive, Putin remains unrepentant. **His only coherent war aims are for more war, more death and more suffering.** His desperate hope is that the world will lose its nerve. It will not. Together we will defy him. Together we will prove him wrong. As President Zelensky told us in his stirring address to the House two weeks ago:

"We know freedom will win. We know Russia will lose. And we really know that victory will change the world"

Slava Ukraini, geroyam slava. [Glory to Ukraine, to the heroes glory]

"In an uncertain world, France and the UK will work cooperatively to address joint challenges - from securing supply chains to driving forward research & development projects."



"This milestone is a significant step forward in the Dreadnought programme, supporting thousands of jobs and apprenticeships across the country, and protecting the UK and our allies for decades to come."




NATIONAL APPRENTICESHIP WEEK 2023

£500,000 OF GOVERNMENT FUNDING TO SUPPORT WALKING AND CYCLING IN GLOUCESTERSHIRE

Alex helped to secure £500,000 from the Government's **Active Travel Capability Fund** to provide a cash injection into sustainable and active travel in Gloucestershire.

The funding will be used to construct the **Cheltenham to Bishops Cleeve Cycle Scheme.**

It is expected that the route will extend from the existing Honeybourne Cycle Link at Prince of Wales Stadium and then will link with and broadly follow the A435 corridor.

Alex said: "Investing in public transport, as well as walking and cycling are crucial to building a cleaner, greener, healthier future. With vision and common sense, a historic opportunity to improve transport in Cheltenham can be seized."

WRITTEN PARLIAMENTARY QUESTIONS

Since the last update, Alex has answered 60 **Written Parliamentary Questions** from MPs. Topics raised include Challenger tanks, aircraft carriers and accommodation for troops.

Q. To ask the Secretary of State for Defence, if he will make an assessment of the implications for his policies of the resolution of the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe of Friday 27 January 2023 on emergence of lethal autonomous weapons systems and their necessary apprehension through European human rights law.

Alex responded:

"The Ministry of Defence has set out its position on lethal autonomous weapons systems in the Defence AI Strategy and accompanying Ambitious, Safe and Responsible policy paper. The UK does not possess fully autonomous weapons systems and has no intention of developing them. The UK considers that the provisions of international law -

particularly International Humanitarian Law - and existing regulatory frameworks are appropriate to new weapons systems and capabilities.

The UK has a developed and considered position and continues to take a proactive role in discussions within international fora. The UK is committed to the Group of Government Experts on LAWS under the auspices of the Convention on Certain Conventional Weapons which is the right forum for taking the debate forward. These are complicated and nuanced issues and given the complexities we need a pragmatic approach based on agreed norms and rules of the road."


