

SPECIAL CHELTENHAM GENERAL HOSPITAL UPDATE

Trust Bosses' Plans

At the end of last week I discovered that local Hospital Trust managers in Gloucestershire had drawn up plans to downgrade the A&E at Cheltenham General Hospital. They had formulated a plan (without telling me or other affected MPs) to put their proposals out for a four week 'engagement', slap bang in the middle of August whilst Parliament wasn't sitting and many were on holiday.

I was absolutely furious when I heard this news, which flies in the face of specific assurances the managers have made to me, as well as the substance of the plans which are contrary to government policy. The very day I was tipped off about the plans I spoke to the Secretary of State, Matt Hancock, who was himself very surprised by what the Trust was planning to announce.

Rumours have circulated about the future of Cheltenham's A&E since 2013, before I was elected, when night-time services were shifted to Gloucestershire Royal (GRH). That downgrade in turn followed on the heels of the loss of Battledown Children's Services and doctor-led maternity services.

I have stated consistently in Parliament and in the press that a further Cheltenham A&E would be completely unacceptable, not just for people in Cheltenham, but for those living right across the north and east of our county. GRH also simply doesn't have capacity as anyone who has been there on a Friday or Saturday night will tell you. Time and again, NHS managers told me this wasn't their plan – even that this was "scaremongering". I am dismayed that those assurances were hollow.

I am particularly angry because I supported our local NHS in their campaign for more funding – helping to secure a settlement that will see cash to the NHS go up from $\pounds122bn$ a year to $\pounds149bn$ a year by 2023. Here in Gloucestershire the Trust has been awarded a

capital grant of £39m plus an additional £10m which I personally helped to extract from the Department of Health (and has helped to fund a state-of-the-art new operating theatre), as well as two new cancer radiotherapy (LINAC) machines.

Back-pedalling

Since I took to social and mainstream media, the Trust has started to row back from the proposal, agreeing to "temporarily pause the next stage of the engagement process due to commence on Monday 5th August."

I warmly welcome this decision. But the Trust now needs to go further and **rule out** downgrading Cheltenham's A&E.
